

Assistant Professor, Psychology

The Department of Psychology at The Catholic University of America seeks to fill a tenure-track Assistant Professor position in Psychology, to begin August 2017. We invite applications within the framework of our **Applied Experimental Psychology** or **Human Development** programs. Research area is open, with special interest in applicants who bridge programs or contribute to departmental emphasis in one of the following areas: children, families, and cultures; neuroscience and cognitive bases of behavior; or positive development and well-being in youth and older adults. Applicants should be committed to excellence in research, teaching, and mentorship, and be prepared to develop a research program that is competitive for external funding.

The Department offers a BA in Psychology, MA degrees in General Psychology and in Human Factors, and a PhD in Applied Experimental, Human Development, and an APA-accredited program in Clinical Psychology. Eleven faculty have active research programs in a range of areas that attract substantial external funding and involve national and international collaborations. The University is located on a 250-acre, park-like campus in northeast Washington DC, convenient to neighboring medical centers, universities and laboratories including the NIH.
